President's Letter

Recent comments and questions have been raised during the Candidate Forums and Board Meetings. I have decided to offer some thoughts and facts regarding these issues.

The Florence Gardens board members are volunteers; we are just like every other member. We have the same aches and pains, monthly bills, and we pay the same assessment that all members pay. I sometimes think that gets forgotten as the criticism flies about. The need for volunteers is always being addressed; they are an integral part in the success of a community such as ours. Criticism can be a huge deterrent to getting and keeping volunteers.

There has been an increase of volunteers since Covid which brought everything to a halt; we have new and younger people moving into the community; and they are volunteering and contributing to new ideas for activities and improvements to our common areas. New committees have been added as well; the BOC is a clear example of the good that can happen when you have volunteers who are willing to offer their time and expertise.

Communication is another subject that is continually being addressed and criticized. This Board has worked very hard to improve information that goes out to the association. The Garden Talk now includes reports from the various committees along with meeting notices (that continue to be published on the bulletin boards in the office lobby as well as the kiosks). Email blasts are sent on a daily and weekly basis with information about meetings, activities, etc. This last summer a Florence Gardens group page was added to Facebook and is open to all members of Florence Gardens.

The FG website along with Caliber offers a plethora of information for all members; you can find minutes from board meetings, copies of our community documents (just a couple of examples of what is out there). There are plans for 2024 to hold some webinars and training classes on how to use the website; and to give people the opportunity to learn the workings of our budgets and financial reports.

The board works very hard to stay informed and we participate in webinars and training sessions offered by HOAMCO, our insurance people as well as our attorneys. These are offered throughout the year, and we do these to stay abreast of HOA statutes and regulations which are constantly changing; we learn about how to deal with lawsuits, our budgets, and reserves. We are volunteers and these additional training/webinars etc. that we all take the time to attend, to ensure we become an enhanced board enabling us to be better for the homeowners and association.

Even with the increase in all expenses due to inflation; the current board in conjunction with the finance committee and a good participation from interested members, we were able to produce a budget with NO increase in the assessment for 2024.

I will close with this quote I recently read. "I take responsibility for the words I say, but not for the way other people twist them". I have always prided myself as being honest and forthright; I don't lie, I believe in God and my Lord Jesus Christ, and try to always follow the Golden Rule "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you".


Assessments were sent out. If you have not received them, please contact us in the office and we can get a copy for you. Assessments are due February 10th and will be late on March 1, 2024.





My first FGMHA annual meeting experience was February 12, 2008. We moved here November 2007 and registered with June Lewis. Appointments: Starting on Friday, January 19, appointments can be made as follows:

- 1) Go to www.aztax-aide.org
- Click on the "Locations" tab at the top of the screen. Depending on the browser you use, you may have to open a "menu" (three horizontal bars in the upper right- or left-hand comer of your screen) then click "Locations".
- 3) Scroll down the page and click on "Pinal County."
- Finally click on Florence Senior Center or Florence Gardens Club House which will open the appointment scheduler for that site.


Be sure you pick a day when you will have all your tax documents available.

Intake Form: AARP Tax-Aide uses an Intake Form which must be completed before your scheduled appointment. Tentatively, an Intake Form may be picked up at the Florence Senior Center, the Florence Gardens Club House, or the Coolidge Senior Center.

AARP Tax-Aide is limited in scope by the IRS and AARP Foundation. Some typical situations that would make a return out-of-scope for Tax-Aide are – complicated self-employment income, rental income from houses/buildings (land-only rentals is allowable), home solar installation tax credits, and electrical vehicle tax credits. Call for clarification if you have questions about your return.

Federal and Arizona state tax returns are the only returns our groups are allowed to prepare. We are not allowed to prepare returns from any other state. We will gladly prepare your federal return if you are able to prepare your own (non-Arizona) state return.

If you need further information or assistance in making an appointment, please call 763-486-5730, on Tuesday or Friday between 9:00 AM and NOON. Leave a Voice Mail if needed.
